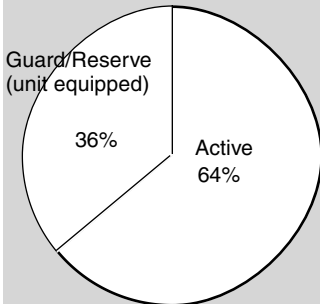

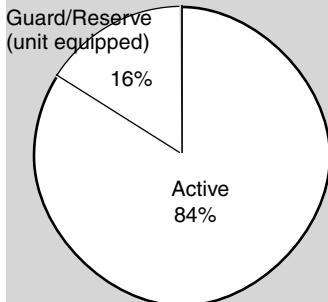

## A Changing Force Mix Active-Duty, Air National Guard, and Air Force Reserve Crews

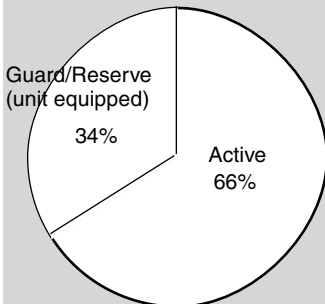

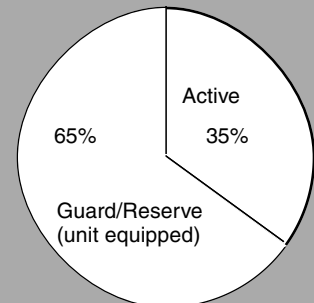
*In an Air Force with fewer active-duty officers and airmen, the Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve must shoulder more of the post-Cold War mission. Guard and Reserve forces provide a huge share of USAF's mobility crews. ANG and AFRES fighter units regularly deploy alongside active-duty units in peacetime operations, such as Deny Flight in Bosnia-Herzegovina and Provide Comfort and Southern Watch in Iraq. The bomber force structure includes an Air Force Reserve squadron at Barksdale AFB, La., flying B-52s and an Air National Guard squadron at McConnell AFB, Kan., flying B-1Bs. A second Guard squadron of B-1Bs is slated to stand up at Robins AFB, Ga., in 1996.*

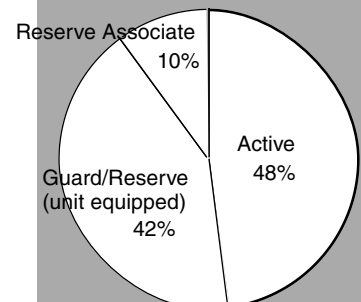
