As you are aware, there is a well established tradition of providing the members of the House Armed Services Committee (HASC) with your service's unfunded requirements. Given the increasing operational demands of Operation Enduring Freedom and the International Security Assistance Force-Afghanistan, as well as the continuing demands that Operation Iraqi Freedom and other operations associated with the Global War on Terrorism are placing on the services, it is more important than ever that Congress understand these unfunded requirements in order to fulfill its constitutional duty of providing adequate resources for our Armed Forces.

We understand the fiscal year 2011 defense budget will not include full funding for several of the programs and priorities in each of the services. In keeping with the past practice of submitting to the HASC lists of the programs and requirements that have not been selected for funding in the President's Budget, I am writing to request that you send forward this information for the fiscal year 2011 budget cycle. Please provide me with your service's list at the same time as the full President's Budget Request is delivered to the committee.
